A. 2022 Wastewater (Sewer) Rate Increase

The City of Austell has not had an increase in wastewater rates in over 5 years. On September 14, 2021, Cobb County Board of Commissioners passed an 11% increase (\$.52 per 1000 gallons). To cover this increase & as increases in City operational expenses, the Public Works Committee would like to increase the wastewater rate by 15% or an additional \$.44 per 1000 gallons. This would cost the average customer approximately \$5.13 per month.

The recommendation is to approve the proposed 15 percent increase to wastewater rates. See below:
